

Getting Started

Here is what you need:

- 1. A wreath of evergreens and five candles, 4 of the same size and one larger, all placed inside the wreath.
- 2. Find a prominent place to put the wreath such as your coffee table or fireplace mantle.
- 3. Once a week, gather around the wreath with your family or roommates and intentionally use this time to be filled with the wonder of God's great love demonstrated through the birth of Christ.

How to begin:

- 1. Turn off the TV, radio, or other distractions and enjoy some silence
- 2. Light the particular candle(s)
- 3. Grab your Bible, read the Scripture and discuss it
- 4. Pray together



"Joy to the World" - Luke 2:10-12

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
-Luke 2:10-12

The Christmas season annually reminds us that God still offers joy to the world! Biblical joy is not a shallow happiness based in our surroundings or circumstances, rather it is a deep confidence rooted in the person of Jesus Christ, what He has done, and will do. I personally have had my joy tested recently and seek to choose daily not to let anything steal the joy I have in Jesus.

This Advent Guide has one goal, which is to help you and your family keep Christ your focus this Christmas. Advent means "arrival or coming" and many believers in Jesus choose to be intentional during Advent season (the month leading up to Christmas), to deepen their devotion to Jesus our Savior, who came in the form of a baby. Practicing Advent has always blessed our family with wonder and joy and it has been such a blessing to celebrate Advent with our Sunnyside Church family.

If this is a new practice for you, we have made it super simple! Some members of our staff have written a devotional with a Scripture, questions, and sometimes a practical application. The goal is to do this once a week and then the fifth one on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. You can do this alone or with a house full. Either way you're choosing to make Christ your joy during the Christmas season, which sometimes can be difficult.

I want to invite you to do two things with your renewed joy in Jesus. Ask God to give you eyes for someone who could use some joy this season and discover a way to encourage or help them. Secondly, let's all consider who we can invite to one of our Christmas Eve services, Sunday, December 24th 10am or 4pm. I'm always amazed how people are more receptive to church invites this time of the year.

I pray this Advent our hearts and our community will be filled with the good news of Jesus which will cause great joy for all who believe!

Bethlehem Candle

Sunday, December 3rd

Just as Mary was ready to give birth, there was no room for her in the inn. But our Father in heaven knows what we need, and when we need it. Light two of the smaller candles

Read Luke 2:4-7

Reflect

- In what area in your life are you lacking joy?
- Can you remember a time when God came through for you in a way you did not expect?

Pray

We thank you for sending your son, Jesus, "the bread of life" to be born at just the right time, and in just the right place. Thank you for the joy that you continually offer us through your son. In your son Jesus' name. Amen

Angel Candle

Sunday, December 10th

Seeing the angel arrive would have been terrifying and confusing. Yet the message is, "do not fear." That is the great message of comfort that Jesus himself said to his disciples and to us today. The message is beyond fear and the reason is the joyful hope that only God fulfills. The physical sign of God's promise to us was a baby, wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger. As a final step, this one angel is joined by heaven's angels praising God. The ability to enter in with praising for the miracle is up to you. Join in the joyful praise of God's promise as he fulfilled it with the birth of Jesus. Let us go see this thing that has happened! – Ken Shonk

Read Luke 2:8-14

Reflect

- What choices can you make to see Christ for yourself?
- What do you think of God fulfilling promises through you? Would you make different choices for your life?

Shepherd Candle

Sunday, December 17th

The shepherds had a big responsibility tending to their flock of sheep and ensuring that they were healthy and cared for and safe from predators. Being a shepherd was not considered a noble or high held position; however, God chose them to be the first to hear of the arrival of Jesus. Overwhelmed with anticipation they hurried off as their hearts were filled with joy. Seeing the baby lying in the manger they couldn't help but share the joyous news of what the angel had told them, and they left amazed. The shepherds glorified and praised God for all the things they had heard and seen. Just like the shepherds, we too can be joyful no matter how mundane or unpopular our lives may seem right now.
