### **Hebrews 3:1-6**

Therefore, holy brothers and sisters, who share in the heavenly calling, fix your thoughts on Jesus, whom we acknowledge as our apostle and high priest. <sup>2</sup> He was faithful to the one who appointed him, just as Moses was faithful in all God's house. <sup>3</sup> Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself. <sup>4</sup> For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. <sup>5</sup> "Moses was faithful as a servant in all God's house," bearing witness to what would be spoken by God in the future. <sup>6</sup> But Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house. And we are his house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory.

- 1) What does the author mean by "**heavenly calling**" that brothers and sisters share in? (vs. 1)
- 2) To "**fix your thoughts on Jesus,**" sounds really nice and refreshing, right? Share some practical ways we can do this throughout our day?
  - a. How does thinking of Jesus as our apostle help with this?
  - b. How does thinking of Jesus as our high priest help with this?
- 3) Jesus was faithful to the One who appointed Him. In what specific ways was Jesus faithful to our Heavenly Father?
- 4) In chapters 1-2, the contrast was between Christ vs angels, and in chapters 3-4 it will be **Christ vs Moses**. When thinking of the original audience why is contrast here in chapter 3 (Christ vs Moses), so significant?
- 5) Verse six says that God's people are **God's house** and that "Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house." How do "we hold firmly to 1. our confidence and 2. the hope in which we glory" confirming that we really are **God's house**?
