Passage- **Hebrews 2:10-13**

<sup>10</sup> In bringing many sons and daughters to glory, it was fitting that God, for whom and through whom everything exists, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through what he suffered. <sup>11</sup> Both the one who makes people holy and those who are made holy are of the same family. So Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters. <sup>12</sup> He says, "I will declare your name to my brothers and sisters; in the assembly I will sing your praises." <sup>13</sup> And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again he says, "Here am I, and the children God has given me."

- 1) How thankful are you that through our faith in Christ God has brought you to glory?
  - a. When you think of the word "glory" what comes to mind? Why is it significant?
- 2) Did you know you "**exist**" "for" God? How does (or could) that give you more purpose in your day-to-day life?
- 3) Review the details below regarding the word "**pioneer**." How does it deepen your appreciation for all Jesus has done for you?

"Pioneer" – (**archegos** (Greek), is translated author, captain, leader, champion, or pioneer)

"The term was used for both human and divine heroes, founders of schools or those who cut a path forward for their followers & whose exploits for humanity were rewarded by exultation." (IVP Bible Background Commentary).

- 4) Verse 10 also says that God made Jesus "perfect" through what He suffered. We know that Christ was fully God and fully man, was sinless, and in very nature God, so what does it mean He was **made perfect** "through what He suffered"?
- 5) As a believer in Jesus, these verses make it clear you're a child of God, Jesus is your Brother, and others believers are your brothers and sisters in Christ. **What are consistent examples** in your life that show others you're an active part of God's family? If you have a hard time answering that, then what are some possible ways you can be a more active part of God's family?
