

Rejoice! Advent Guide 2024





Getting Started

Here is what you need:

- 1. A wreath of evergreens and five candles, 4 of the same size and one larger, all placed inside the wreath.
- 2. Find a prominent place to put the wreath such as your coffee table or fireplace mantle.
- 3. Once a week, gather around the wreath with your family or roommates and intentionally use this time to be filled with the wonder of God's great love demonstrated through the birth of Christ.

How to begin:

- 1. Turn off the TV, radio, or other distractions and enjoy some silence.
- 2. Light the particular candle(s).
- 3. Grab your Bible, read the Scripture and discuss it.
- 4. Pray together



"Rejoice" - Luke 2:10-11

Advent is the month-long celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ the Savior of the world. Our theme this year is "*Rejoice*" which is the appropriate response to the Light of the world (John 8:12), Jesus, invading the darkness of our world to redeem us and bring us back to God. As we reflect on the amazing arrival of God's love in human form let's *Rejoice* like the angel's did the of Christ's birth!

This Advent Guide is designed to help you and your family (friends, roommates, etc.) create a weekly rhythm to Rejoice in God as you reflect on the miracle of Christ's birth. We have provided some instructions, yet please feel free to have fun with it and be creative in ways that work for you. Our pastoral team would love to hear how your household creatively **Rejoices** in God during the Christmas season. This is a tool to remind us that Christmas is about Christ and to help us praise Him like never before.

I have asked some of the pastoral team to each write one of the five Advent devotionals to help us get to know them a little more, their heart for God, and their love for Christmas. Each week includes a Scripture, a candle to light, a devotional thought, discussion questions, and more! Be reminded that God looks at the heart (1 Samuel 16:7), so don't get caught up in how smooth things go, or how long, but rather having a heart that **Rejoices** in God.

In conjunction with our *Rejoice* theme, the sermons during December will be the songs of Advent found in the Gospel of Luke. This includes the songs of Mary, Zechariah, the angels, Simeon, and more! I have never taught these particular Scriptures so I'm very excited. People need someone to *rejoice* about, so please be prayerfully minded of people in your life who may need and appreciate an invitation to a church service, especially at Christmas.

Please keep these special and identical services in mind and in prayer as you make your holiday plans: Monday, Dec. 23rd @ 7PM and Tuesday, Dec. 24th @ 4PM.

We pray this devotional inspires you to **Rejoice** during Christmastime like never before!

Prophecy Candle

Sunday, December 1st

Read Matthew 1:18-25

Reflect

- In what ways are you going to be celebrating Jesus' coming?
- How do you think you would react if God answered one of your prayers in an unusual way?
- What's something that you want God to do in your life or the lives around you?

Pray

Dear God, I am so grateful that you sent your Son, Jesus, to us to save us from our sins and to do the work that we could not do ourselves. God, today we celebrate you; we celebrate that you came! We put our hope in you, God, and we receive your answers to our prayers however you decide to give them to us. Thank you that you have given us the choice to rejoice! In Jesus' mighty name, we pray, Amen.

Bethlehem Candle

Sunday, December 8th

As I read this familiar story, I am struck by Joseph and Mary's circumstances. What reason do they have to rejoice? Joseph, the defeated descendant of the great king David, returns to the defeated city of David to be numbered in a foreign king's census. Not only that, but he returns amidst scandal; his fiancée is pregnant, and everyone knows the child isn't his. Future generations may call Mary blessed, but the present generation has other things to say. But God does not require perfect circumstances to begin his work. Rather, as life boxes them in, the Savior of the world arrives in a feeding trough: first to the teen girl whose faithfulness was called promiscuity, second to the defeated son of David in the defeated city of David; and from them, to us. We can rejoice with Joseph and Mary because God did not wait for better circumstances to become God With Us. Rather, Jesus steps into our broken circumstances as they are, takes us by the hand, and begins his work of restoration – piece by impossible piece. So let us rejoice! -Alyssa Simonson

- Read Luke 2:4-7

Reflect

- Is there a circumstance in your life where it feels impossible for God to move? Or where you are doing your best to follow God, but feel misunderstood?
- What would it look like to invite God into that space?

Pray

Jesus, thank you that you are Immanuel – God With Us. Thank you that you don't need perfect circumstances to move in my life; all you need is my 'yes.' I invite you into the areas of my life that feel impossible. I ask you to come and be Immanuel, God with me. Help me to remember that there is no situation too impossible for you. Lord, help me to rejoice with faithful anticipation of your work in my life. Amen!

Angel Candle

Sunday, December 15th

Angels are God's messengers who do what he wants done. In God's word, sometimes the messages they brought were good news, and sometimes they were bad news. The angel in this passage had the best news anyone could hope for. God's glory- his beauty and power -shone around. It was startling- better than any special effects in a movie. All of heaven was so excited that a great company of angels showed up after the amazing announcement and praised God for his incredible plan for humanity. Thousands of years later, we too can join with the angels and keep praising God that he sent Jesus, our Savior, our hope. No matter how hard life in this world seems, we can listen to the angel whose message from God was truly good news that continues to bring joy for everyone who believes. Read Luke 2:8-14

Reflect

- Do you feel God's joy inside when you think of Jesus coming to be your personal Savior? How can you express that joy?
- •What things distract you from experiencing God's joy in your heart?

Shepherd Candle

Read Luke 2:15-20

Reflect

- How can you spread joy to those who may be going through hard times or have lost all their joy?
- Share a moment God has brought you joy.
- Who is soeone you can invite to a Christmas Eve Service?
