Read- Job 2:1-13 (& chapter 3)

Scriptures from Sermon: Job 1:5, 21, 3:25-26, 13:15, & 42:2; Ps. 100:5; & Eph. 6:13-20

Questions:

1. Have you ever thought or been told that following Jesus would be easy or not involve pain (& suffering)? Why would this kind of thought or teaching be dangerous and misleading? (repeat, if necessary 😊)
 - A. How does the Book of Job dismantle that kind of thinking or teaching?
2. In chapter 2, Job faces his second test. What was it exactly? How did Job respond? Is that surprising to you? Why or why not?
 - A. What did his wife tell him to do? Why is it important for us to filter (test) all advice, even from a spouse (or someone close to us), by Scripture?
3. In Chapter 2:11-13, Job's friends show up to comfort him. What did they do exactly and what didn't they do? How can we apply this when we want to support others going through grief and pain?
4. We learn in Chapter 3:25, that Job was human after all and did deal with fear. Read Chapter 1:5, and discuss what Job's fear really was.
 - A. Can you identify with Job regarding "fear" for your kids?
 - B. If not as a parent, what is something you fear?
5. Pastor DJ, in this sermon, said to combat fear we need to have a Feisty Faith.

Define Feisty- is an adjective that describes someone or something as lively, determined, and full of courage or spirit, often despite being the underdog or smaller in stature. (Google)
